## **SAMPLE Pitching and Defense Lineup Card**

On this side of the card you show your pitching rotation, along with your bullpen pitchers, listed in the order you'd like them to be used as starters if needed. A pitcher gets replaced when he reaches his hook number. The **hook number** is **equal** to the **number of runs** that pitcher has allowed, **plus half** of the **runners** currently **on base**. Pitchers (as are batters) are limited to playing roughly as much as they did per week during that year in the majors, making a deep bullpen very important. If you run entirely out of pitchers, we'll provide an automatic replacement, similar to calling up a weak pitcher from the minors (with an ERA of about 6.10 in the NL or 6.80 in ALs).

Full instructions are given on the accompanying sheet. We used NL players for this example card, but the rules are exactly the same for both the AL and NL pitching cards. PLEASE NOTE THAT A 4 MAN ROTATION IS USED IN THE WINTER GAME.
